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

December 2015

We have had wonderful weather for harvesting and field work this fall. Despite the current cooler temperatures, the weather appears to be in a holding pattern. For some the weather may not be ideal such as those hunting, but a normalcy in temperature is needed for our cattle as the large fluctuations in temperature can lead to a litany of issues like respiratory disease.

With the temperature dropping and skiffs of snow starting to appear on the ground, we are entering UW-Extension meeting season. A regional meeting about cattle hoof care will take place on December 9th in Kimberly at Liberty Hall. Dr. Dorte Dopfer will be speaking about digital dermatitis, an all too familiar problem in our cattle herds. She is an associate professor from the UW-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine, Food Animal Production Medicine Section. This would be a great meeting for producers and herdspeople to attend for current research and hands-on informational sessions.

If you are a private pesticide applicator looking to recertify or you need a commercial pesticide applicator certification, three in-person trainings will be occurring this winter starting in January. Events, Deadlines and Notes

Farmland Rental Options Workshop

This annual workshop is recommended for owners of rented land. The focus is on land rent realities and options that can make land rental situations better for all parties involved with the emphasis on crop production economics.

The sessions are free and will be held on Wednesday, December 2, starting at 10:00 am, at the Chase Town Hall, located at 8481 Cty S, Sobieski and Thursday, December 3 at 6:30 pm, at the Pound Town Hall, located on the east edge of Coleman on Cty B. Discussion will focus on the details that you should consider when negotiating a farm rental contract. Such details certainly include price, but other factors such as length of lease, any limitations you may place on the property, and many other aspects can all be negotiated into the contract. There are also many different leasing options available and Scott Reuss will detail some of the advantages and disadvantages of different types of annual or multi-year leasing contracts.

Contract templates of multiple types will be available as handouts, ranging from extremely simple to more complex arrangements. The discussion will focus on basic cropland rental situations, but can expand to building leases, grazing land, and other situations which attendees are interested in discussing.

Annual CAFO Meetings

Fond du Lac—February 11th and Green Bay—February 12th

This is the annual update meeting for WPDES permitted farms and all the consultants that work with them. If your farm is on the verge of WPDES permit size or you are wondering about some of the logistics of post-permit management, you may want to consider attending.

Grow Wisconsin Dairy 30 x 20 Producer Grants

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection (DATCP) are seeking applications for the next round of *Grow Wisconsin Dairy 30 x 20 producer grants*. The Grow Wisconsin Dairy Grant is a flexible grant available to producers to facilitate operational changes, improve profitability, and increase efficiency.

The Grow Wisconsin Grant strives to improve the long-term viability of Wisconsin's Dairy Industry. Recipients of this grant can be awarded as much as \$5,000 and would be required to pay a cost share of 20 percent of the total grant awarded.

This grant is designed to provide access to services and resources for proposed dairy farm projects that enhance or develop the current business

and/or solve an existing problem or concern on the farm. Customized to meet the needs of individual farms, this grant can be applied to hire consultants with a range of expertise to address specific business needs.

Pricing Wet Corn? UW-Extension has an app for that!

To help farmers better evaluate their options, the University of Wisconsin-Extension has developed a Smartphone app to provide a simple way to help estimate the market value of HMSC based on three main variables-dry moisture corn, current corn moisture and price per bushel.



The HMSC\$ app is free and

available for Android smartphones and tablets on the Google Play store by searching "HMSC" or go to: https://play.google.com/store/apps/details?id=com.smartmapps.corncalculator&hl=en.

Farmers can use this app to help determine value for wet shell corn when compared with dry shell corn price—a link to current elevator dry corn bid prices is built into the app. The equivalent wet price is then calculated and displayed in both price per ton and price per bushel.

Additional costs for drying and/or shelling can be evaluated under the expense tab. The app also features the ability to email the results directly to others.
