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

<u>Wanted—Dairy Farms to Participate in Research</u> Project

A research project is being conducted by Sarah Mills-Lloyd, DVM for dairy operations of various sizes which have persisting neonatal calf diarrhea problems for longer than a month in duration. Twelve farms will be selected to participate in this study—free of charge. If you currently have neonatal calf diarrhea issues on your farm, please contact Sarah in the Oconto County UW-Extension office to see if you qualify for this program which will offer free laboratory diagnostic evaluations valued at \$450.00. This all day event will include classwork in addition to onfarm practice to help participants learn skills to evaluate farms. The program aims to provide a consistent platform for animal well-being, which producers can use to evaluate their on-farm animal care practices. Training will take place on July 8, 2014 at the Marathon County UW-Extension Office. Space is limited for this event; the cost of registration is \$250 per person.
