PRIVATE PESTICIDE APPLICATOR TRAINING

Florence, Marinette and Oconto Counties

You have two options to become certified or recertified as a private pesticide applicator. The first is to attend one of the private pesticide applicator training programs conducted by UW-Extension and then satisfactorily complete the evaluation at the end of that session. The second is to study the materials on your own and arrange to take the test in either Marinette or Florence. Either method has a \$40 fee which covers the five years of the license period.

A minimum score of 50 percent must be achieved on the evaluation administered at the end of the training. Those choosing the test only option must score 70 percent. The test is open book and you are allowed 2 hours, with retakes (if necessary) at no extra cost.

There are three training & test sessions which will be held in our immediate area in 2017:

Tuesday, January 10 Oconto Falls Public Library

Wednesday, February 1 Pound Town Hall

Friday, February 17 Oc. Falls Public Library

Training sessions will begin at 10 a.m., with an optional half-hour discussion of Crop Insurance Programs starting at 9:30 a.m. Most participants are done around 2:30 to 3p.m.

-Is the Private Applicator Training the right category for me??

12:30 to 2:30 p.m. Containing Production Costs in 2017

Calculating costs of production helps us plan our planting and other management decisions, but what can we actually do to contain those costs? What are the ways we can shave pennies off our per bushel cost of production, so that we have the opportunity to make more dollars per acre. We will look at all the different inputs, what we can expect to receive in the realm of return on investment of those inputs, and examine the implications of cutting costs in a tight budgeting year such as 2017 is currently projected.

Did you make money on your grain acres in 2016? Do you still have grain in storage that is not priced? What about 2017 production – what is the pricing outlook and what can we do to be proactive about grain marketing, while not placing our farm at any extra risk?

There are many uncertainties when we start marketing our crops. However, there are certain cycles to the grain marketing year that any crop producer can take into account to help them plan out their grain marketing strategies. This can be especially true in a lower grain price climate. We will be concentrating on the grain price annual cycle and how to put a plan into place through which you make sound decisions that take emotion out of your pricing decisions. In the process, we will analyze the different pricing or protection tools that you can use in your marketing plan.

Proper marketing does not mean getting the best price per bushel. However, a good marketing plan will usually net extra pennies/nickels/dimes per bushel, which all add up and can help you increase your bottom line.

One step of proper marketing is knowing your cost of production, so we will start the day with a review of the calculated costs of production put together at the Jan. 19 meeting, and how you can go about modifying those costs to get an accurate estimate for your operation. Having an understanding of your costs will allow you to make better, more confident decisions regarding pre-harvest pricing opportunities.

Succession planning includes planning for the owner generation's later years; business planning to ensure the operation has financial capacity; developing the successor's management skills; and estate and tax planning.

Estate planning needs to happen whether or not there will be a business succession. Careful consideration of the owners' goals and the tools available is important to develop the right plan.

This webinar is for both the owner and successor generations to learn about estate planning tools and how to develop a plan with the help of estate planning professionals. If a business succession is involved, it is important to ensure the business assets are available in some way for the incoming business successor.
