### Fruit Tree Pruning Workshops Armstrong Creek - Sat., March 29 Aurora - Sat., April 5

UW-Extension of Marinette & Florence Counties are sponsoring a pair of Fruit Tree Pruning Workshops. These hands-on workshops allow you to learn about and practice proper pruning and training techniques on your fruit trees.

Pruning of fruit trees is necessary if growers want their trees to have optimal health and high production capacity and now is the ideal time to be doing these yearly pruning activities. Proper pruning also helps increase fruit size and quality by assisting with your insect and disease management

and by regulating fruit set. Optimal timing of pruning activities in a normal year is late February through early April, but can be earlier or later due to late winter temperature patterns.

The Armstrong Creek workshop is being hosted by Armstrong Creek Bison Ranch, north of U.S. Hwy 8 about 1 mile on County Line Road, likely starting at 10:30 am (but contact Scott to double-check final timing).

The Aurora workshop is being hosted by Larry & Sharon Chick, on East Fischer Lake Parkway - south of Cty. Hwy. N about two miles (watch for signs), starting at 10 a.m.

Participants will have the chance to learn the how and why of proper pruning and then apply those new skills with hands-on practice. The majority of the program will be conducted outside, so dress appropriately. Scott Reuss, UW-Extension Crops/Horticulture Agent, will be leading participants through the day's activities and will be demonstrating young tree training techniques, as well as how to 'fix' older trees that may need more assistance.

There is a \$5 registration fee for this workshop to cover the cost of the publications which will be distributed as part of the opportunity, and refreshments.
