Travel Experiences Committee Announces \$200 Available for WI 4-H Arts Camp, October 7-8th

The Travel Experiences Committee would like to announce they have \$200 available to interested 4-H members that would like to attend WI 4-H Arts Camp. WI 4-H Arts Camp will be held on October 7-8, at Upham Woods, WI Dells.

WI 4-H Arts Camp is designed for youth in grades 6-8 to come together and explore the "ARTS." You will participate in six one hour sessions that focus on **communication**, **music**, **theater**, **circus**, **photography** or **visual arts**.

You'll rotate through the different Arts tracks each day, participate in a group Arts experience Saturday evening, and close with a ceremony for parents and families, celebrating the results of your group Arts Camp experiences. You'll also meet new friends, participate in camp games, and enjoy the great natural setting of Upham Woods, a 300-acre environmental education center on the Wisconsin River, N194 County Road N, Wisconsin Dells.

WI 4-H Arts Camp is planned and led by a talented group of 4-H youth and adult volunteers and staff. Adult Advisors participate fully in the camp program and provide support for the youth participants. *Additional adult support is needed!* If you know of an adult who would enjoy helping create a lively "ARTS" experience for our campers, encourage them to complete an Adult Advisor Application in 4H Online.

Camp is \$80.00 for campers and \$50.00 for Adult Advisors. The \$200 from the Travel Experiences Committee will be split among the interested 4-H members. The fees for the campers and adult advisors include meals and snacks, lodging and a camp T-shirt!

When creating your entry, remember that winning entries make use of ingredients that are readily available.



Then with parent's help, mail the colored picture or take a picture of the colored image and email it to us. Age groups are 5-8, 9-10 and 11-13 years of age. Contest open to all youth enrolled in Oconto County 4-H.

Submissions must be received by September 30, 2017. One entry per child. Note: colored pictures will not be returned after the contest, and may be used by Barn Quilts of Oconto County as seen fit.

4HONLINE

Re-Enroll Members/Leaders

GETTING STARTED

To get started with the re-enrollment process, log into 4HOnline with your family email and password.

On the family home screen, click on the orange button labeled Continue to Family.

On your Member/Volunteer list, find the family member you wish to re-enroll and click on Edit next to their name.

RE-ENROLL

At the bottom of the next screen, click on the button for Enroll for 2017-2018.

If the youth is over 17 years old, a box will appear asking if you wish to enroll as a youth or an adult. If the youth is graduating from 4-H and wants to continue as an adult leader, then choose **Enroll As Adult**, otherwise select **Enroll as Youth.**

You will now see the Personal Information that you entered when you first enrolled. Look over the information and make any corrections. If the youth was in 12^{th} grade last year, you must select the grade for this year, either **Post High School Education** or **Not in School**. When you are done, click on **Continue**.

Next is the Additional Information screen where you will need to accept the agreements and answer the Photo Release and Accommodations questions. Click **Continue** when done.

The Health Form for members is optional at enrollment, but you could be asked to complete it in the future if you attend any events that require one. Click **Continue** when done.

If you are an adult volunteer and see the Volunteer Screening page, then it has been 4 years since the last time a background check has been completed. You need to check over the answers to the questions and correct as needed. This page will only appear every 4 years. Click **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Club screen, confirm the correct club is listed. If you serve in a volunteer role (but not as a project leader) click on **Edit** and select the volunteer type. Click on **Update** to save the change. Click on **Continue** when done.

On the Participation -> Projects screen, confirm all the projects you are enrolled in are listed. Add any missing projects. If you are dropping a project, click on **Edit** for that project and then click on **Delete**. After making sure all your projects are listed correctly, click on **Submit Enrollment**.
