Instructions for Water Test Kits

Enclosed you will find the following:

- A list of water samples available along with costs.
 - Please note the “Homeowner Package” which includes the first 8 tests and is the package recommended by the Water and Environmental Analysis Lab for home use.
 - *Please mail a check for \$60.00 with your water sample. Make the check payable to “Water & Environmental Analysis Lab – UWSP”*
 - Additional tests are available at additional costs. The additional tests are listed at the bottom of the front page and on the back page.
- A form to be filled out, along with instructions for taking the sample.
 - Fill out as much information on the front of the form as you can, including sampling date and time.
 - Follow instructions precisely for taking the sample. (Instructions on the back of the form.)
 - Mail sample with completed form and check in the Styrofoam container provided. Place check & form in plastic bag provided. Secure container with tape.
 - **Obtain and Mail** your sample on **Monday afternoon**.
- “Interpreting Drinking Water Quality Results” & “Maintaining your home well water system” to read at your leisure.
