


Horse Quiz Bowl

New this year, one of our 4-H leader's, Brigid McDowell, is starting a horse quiz bowl team. She is looking for teammates and another leader or two to help her out. If you are interested or have questions please reach out to Brigid at 920-834-9947, this is a land line and doesn't receive text messages.

The 4-H Horse Bowl provides an opportunity for youth in grades 3-13 and enrolled in 4-H horse or horseless projects to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting. These contests provide an educational experience for both participants and spectators.

Youth answer questions in teams of 3 or 4 members and compete against other teams in the same class. Senior class competitors also complete a written exam on their knowledge.

These events consist of quiz-style questions about the following topics: Nutrition and Feed, Health and Diseases, History, Evolution and Breeds, Reproduction and Genetics, Anatomy, and Showmanship Basics.

New, Free 4-H Harmony Guide

Do you ever feel like you're running out of ideas for icebreakers or ways to help youth connect? The 4-H Harmony Guide: Meet Up, Buddy Up, is a set of hundreds of cards and activities you can use with youth of all ages.

Best of all, it's a new, free download from Shop4-H!

Three types of cards (Collaborations, Conversations, and Community Builders) are designed for two different age groups (Early Childhood and Upper Grades). All the cards are meant to build connection and community by helping youth meet up with each other and buddy up to work and play together. Make conversations a regular part of 4-H gatherings. Regular conversations, even short ones, can help young people connect to others and build a sense of belonging. Conversations can also help young people learn and develop important life skills that help them thrive! Club and Project volunteers can use these cards in meetings with youth. Camp counselors and other youth leaders

can use them in their programs. The cards can be a training tool or just for fun.

Thriving Survey

In November, Wisconsin 4-H will be encouraging members (ages 13-18) to complete a survey about their 4-H experience. The survey was developed by <u>National 4-H Leaders</u> and will help Wisconsin 4-H to learn about the quality of our programs. The information will help to show how 4-H helps young people to learn new things, develop leadership skills, manage goals, set high personal standards, create positive academic attitudes, and other skills that lead to long-term success in life.

Member Re-Enrollment

Our new enrollment year for 2025 began on October 1.

Members and leaders must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd grade or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

Re-enrollment deadline is November 30, 2024.

*New members can join at any time but must enroll by April 30 to enter in the Fair. *April 30 is also the deadline to add or drop projects. *You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

Space Camp

May 1-5, 2025. 4-H Space Camp is an educational experience where youth from across the state take a bus down to Huntsville, Alabama, for a 4 day journey. Youth get the opportunity to venture away from home to meet new friends, develop leadership and teamwork skills, and learn all about space. Any youth in grades 6-8 may register to go to Space Camp. Register through 4HOnline for Space Camp. Registration will be open from November 15-December 15 prior to program year.

Delegates will be notified by the State 4-H Office by January 12 of the program year whether they are attending or wait-listed. After registration closes, delegates will be sent a link to register for Space Camp through the Space Camp website. All delegates must register online for Space Camp prior to March 1st.

All youth grades 8-10 are invited to experience history & heritage by immersing in a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast and Canada — Youth-led content throughout the experience — Increase knowledge of American history while experiencing where it occurred — Dynamic exposure to diverse cultural experiences and perspectives of the foundation of our nation.

WI 4-H Foundation Kicks off Photography Contest

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts Photography Contest is open to any current Wisconsin 4 -H member, and the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation is awarding cash prizes. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. Entries are being accepted now through January 31, 2025.

The contest is broken into three categories:

- 1. General Photography
- 2. 4-H Experience Photography
- 3. Clovers on Film

A winner will be chosen in each category with a Best of Show award given to one entry chosen by the judging committee. Category winners will receive a \$50 cash award. The Best of Show entry will receive an additional \$100 cash award. Other photographs may be recognized but will not receive a cash award. To be eligible for the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Photography Contest, youth must be a 4-H member enrolled in 4H Online for the 2024-2025 4-H Program Year.

Entry Information

- Entries will be accepted from Friday, November 1, 2024, until midnight on Friday, January 31, 2025.
- A photo of the entry and the completed entry form must be submitted through the contest website: <u>https://wis4hfoundation.org/celebrate-the-arts/</u>
- Each photographer may submit up to one entry in each of the three categories but may submit only one entry in each category.

The winning photos from each category and the Best of Show will become the property of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. In addition, any entry may be used by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation to promote the 4-H program and/or to raise funds for the Wisconsin 4-H program. Proceeds from any Celebrate the Arts event or sales will be split evenly with half invested in the Talen Endowment for 4-H Arts Programming and half used for arts programming in the next 4-H program year.

*Any Wisconsin 4-H club or individual member may reserve ONE promotion date.

*Promotion reservations are available for each Saturday or Sunday of the Paper Clover Campaign (Nov. 30, Dec.1, 7, 8, 14, 15, 2024). The timing of the promotion is determined by the Store Manager.

*Only one club or individual may do an in-store promotion at any store at one time. Time slots are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

*To reserve a date, click on the link below. Fill out the reservation form (all fields are required). *When you have confirmed your date, the club or individual MUST get Store Manager permission to do the promotion. The Store Manager will provide info about what is allowed, timing, location, etc.

CLAIMING YOUR REWARD: When the promotion is completed, in order to receive your reward, clubs/ individuals must email a photo of the activity (but several photos are appreciated!) within 30 days, and the WI 4-H Foundation will send the gift card to the address provided on the reservation form. Photos may

be used for marketing purposes and on social media.
